REGULATIONS

Updated as of 15th Feb 2026

1. Purpose and Nature of the Ranking

1.1 Purpose of the System

1.1.1 The Mach25 Ranking is the official annual classification system of Mach25 Gaming, designed to organize and recognize the performance of teams participating in accredited competitions. Its purpose is to provide a common, transparent, and stable framework that allows competitive activity to be measured throughout the season.

1.1.2 The Mach25 Ranking is the criterion used by Mach25 Gaming to determine the teams eligible to participate in its special on-site and online events.

1.1.2.1 Although it constitutes a fundamental criterion, it is not the only factor considered. Mach25 Gaming may take into account additional elements, such as team availability, specific sporting criteria of the event, technical requirements, or strategic decisions related to the development of the competitive ecosystem.

1.1.3 The Mach25 Ranking contributes to the professionalization of the ecosystem by promoting continued participation, long-term planning, and the creation of an annual competitive narrative.

1.1.4 The system guarantees equal opportunities among teams by applying uniform scoring and result-verification criteria across all accredited competitions.

2. Scope of Application

2.1 Accredited Events

2.1.1 The Ranking applies to all Gran Turismo 7 competitions that have been admitted and certified by Mach25 Gaming.

2.2 External Organizers

2.2.1 External organizers may request the accreditation of their events, provided they meet the technical and competitive integrity requirements established by Mach25 Gaming.

3. Duration of the Season

3.1 Official Dates

3.1.1 The Mach25 Ranking season covers the period from September 1 to August 31 of the following year.

3.1.2 During this period, points earned in all accredited competitions that meet the requirements established by Mach25 Gaming will be accumulated.

3.2 Publication of the Final Classification

3.2.1 After the conclusion of each accredited competition, Mach25 Gaming will update the Mach25 Ranking, incorporating the points earned and any relevant incidents.

3.2.2 Once the season has ended, a final classification will be published after verifying all results, sanctions, and pending corrections.

3.2.3 The final classification will be published through Mach25 Gaming's official channels, including the website mach25gaming.com and corporate social media.

3.2.4 Any modification after the publication of the final classification may only be made in exceptional cases, such as demonstrable errors in results or sanctions applied retroactively.

4. Scoring System

4.1 Scoring Categories

4.1.1 Each accredited competition is assigned a scoring category that determines the number of points awarded according to the team's final position.

4.1.1.1 The categories, ordered from highest to lowest, are: 2000, 1000, 500, 250, and 125.

4.1.1.2 The category assigned to each competition will depend on factors such as duration, format, competitive level, number of participants, and relevance within the Mach25 Gaming ecosystem.

4.1.1.3 Mach25 Gaming will publish the category assigned to each event prior to its start, ensuring transparency and predictability for participating teams.

4.2 Distribution of Points

4.2.1 Points are awarded in decreasing order according to the team's final position in the accredited competition.

4.2.2 The specific points table for each category will be published through Mach25 Gaming's official channels and may be updated at the beginning of each season.

4.2.3 In the event of ties in the final classification of an event, the tie-breaking criteria defined by the organizer of the accredited competition will apply.

4.2.4 Points earned by a team are cumulative throughout the season and are added directly to its total in the Mach25 Ranking.

4.3 Validity and Binding Nature of Results

4.3.1 Points earned by a team during the season are linked to its Recognized Sporting Identity (IDR), not solely to its name or public image.

4.3.1.1 The IDR is the minimum unit recognized by Mach25 Gaming to consider that a team remains the same throughout the season, regardless of its name, logo, or public image.

4.3.1.1.1 The IDR is based on verifiable criteria, not on legal documents:

Principal sporting representative, also known as Team Manager.

Continued sporting core: A minimum continuity of regularly competing drivers will be assessed. They do not need to be the same individuals at all times, but continuity must exist to prevent teams from "buying" points by signing drivers from other teams.

Verifiable competitive history: Preference will be given to teams with a high degree of participation in previously held accredited competitions, serving as a sporting footprint of the entity.

Declaration of sporting identity: A simple document in which the team declares its name, representative, main or roster drivers, and communication channels or social media.

4.3.2 A team may request a single name or visual identity change per season, provided that the continuity of its IDR is verified.

4.3.2.1 Mach25 Gaming will evaluate the request by reviewing the representative, the sporting core, and the competitive history.

4.3.3 To request an identity change, the team must pay a certification fee intended to cover the verification process required to ensure the continuity of its Recognized Sporting Identity (IDR) and protect the integrity of the Mach25 Ranking. This fee will also cover administrative costs associated with updating graphic materials, competitive histories, databases, and any other elements linked to the team's identity within the Mach25 Gaming ecosystem.

4.3.3.1 The amount of the fee will be determined by Mach25 Gaming based on factors such as the complexity of the requested change, the volume of information to be updated, or the administrative workload involved. The team will be informed of the corresponding amount at the beginning of the procedure, before formal verification begins.

4.3.4 Mach25 Gaming may approve, condition, or deny the requested change. In case of denial, the team must retain its previous identity to preserve its points.

4.3.4.1 Attempting to compete under an unauthorized identity may result in total loss of points.

4.3.5 All approved changes will be published through Mach25 Gaming's official channels, ensuring transparency for all teams and the competitive ecosystem.

4.3.5.1 Mach25 Gaming will issue an official statement announcing the start of the verification process for the requested identity change. Once the process is completed, and regardless of the outcome, a new statement will be published notifying the resolution. Both statements will be disseminated through Mach25 Gaming's official channels to ensure transparency and public awareness of the procedure.

4.4 Scoring of New or Debuting Teams

4.4.1 Teams joining the Mach25 Ranking during the season will begin with zero points and will compete on equal terms with all other teams.

4.4.2 They will have full rights to all rewards, benefits, invitations, and opportunities derived from the Mach25 Ranking, provided they meet the requirements established for each of them.

5. Integrity and Conduct

5.1 Behavioural Standards

5.1.1 All participants in the Mach25 Ranking are subject to Mach25 Gaming's regulations, both sporting and disciplinary.

5.1.1.1 Any serious breach of these regulations or of the principles of sportsmanship, respect, and fair play may result in sanctions imposed by Mach25 Gaming. These sanctions may include partial or total loss of points, annulment of results obtained in accredited competitions, temporary suspension of the team or its members, or permanent expulsion from the Mach25 Ranking in the most severe cases.

5.1.1.2 Serious breaches include, among others: repeated unsportsmanlike conduct, use of offensive or discriminatory language, manipulation of results, impersonation of sporting identity, participation in acts that harm the integrity of the competitive ecosystem, or any action that Mach25 Gaming considers contrary to the spirit of the Ranking.

5.1.1.3 Sanctions applied by organizers of accredited competitions may be recognized and adopted by Mach25 Gaming within the Ranking, provided they meet proportionality criteria and are duly justified.

5.1.1.4 Mach25 Gaming reserves the right to open internal investigations when reasonable indications of inappropriate conduct exist, even if no formal complaint has been submitted. During the process, the team or driver involved must cooperate by providing the required information.

6. Review and Modifications

6.1 Regulation Updates

Annual review before the start of the season, with adjustments made to improve clarity and functionality.

6.2 Communication of Changes

6.2.1 Publication on the website and social media.

6.2.2 Immediate entry into force unless otherwise indicated.

6.3 Contact with Mach25 Gaming
